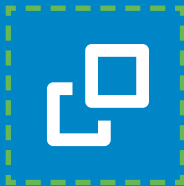

Established in 1992, SFI is a private, non-profit alliance of local businesses, the Saginaw County Chamber of Commerce, the County and City of Saginaw, 16 local municipalities, education, labor organizations and local foundations.



Mission and Vision

To advance economic growth in Saginaw County.

To be the leading organization in Saginaw County, providing proactive and focused economic development assistance, striving for diversified growth, job creation and retention, increased business investment and tax base, and a positive environment for businesses to thrive.



Services & Expertise

Saginaw Future assists companies with financial and incentive packaging, state programs, government contracts, identifying and developing sites and provides access to shovel ready FREE land. SFI also serves as an advocate for business investment projects, connects with resources to address workforce needs and serves as a community liaison, through our service contracts with local and state government partners.



Budget

SFI is a non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation with an annual operating budget of \$1.2 million. SFI contracts with the County and City of Saginaw and 16 local units of government for economic development services, and receives nearly half of its funding from 206 private business contributors, foundations, sponsors and individuals. SFI also receives grants from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) and U.S. Department of Defense for procurement initiatives.

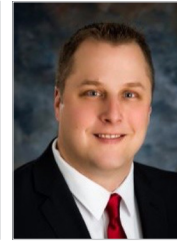

(SCE) will break ground next spring on a 142,000 sq. ft. facility in the Great Lakes Tech Park. The project includes office, production and warehouse space. Since 1963, SCE has been manufacturing both standard and custom electrical enclosures. The company headquarters and its 310,000 sq. ft. manufacturing facility will remain in Saginaw Charter Township. That site is completely built out and landlocked. SCE expects to create 35 jobs over the next five years and the MEDC, EDC of the County of Saginaw, Thomas Township and SFI supported the project's development.

Turn One builds steering systems for NASCAR and since 1997 has supplied steering products for 28 of the past 57 NASCAR Champions. Turn One recently purchased new equipment that will help the company in-source component production and Intricate Machine – dba Eagle Machine will do work for them. Solutions-4-Automation is a City of Saginaw-based company that added 5,000 sq ft to its existing structure after an addition last year. Solutions-4-Automation manufactures test and automation equipment. Other areas of expertise include robotics, material handling and fixtures. is a high-tech manufacturing business headquartered in Italy with facilities located in Germany and the US Pacific Northwest. In 2018, Umbra purchased Thomson Aerospace and Defense from Meggitt located at 628 N. Hamilton St. in the City of Saginaw. SFI has assisted the company throughout the acquisition, including the relocation of staff from Italy. Umbra plans to make significant investments to improve and update the facility and equipment. SFI is working with the City of Saginaw on incentives to support the growth.

partnered with the Saginaw County Land Bank to continue the clean up near its City of Saginaw facility. Saginaw Future assisted through its administration of the Saginaw County Brownfield Authority, which provided the Land Bank with a loan of up to \$800,000 to demolish buildings connected to the company. B&P invested nearly \$500,000 to reconstruct the façade of its building. This recent activity is a continuation of a \$1 million EPA Superfund cleanup of the former Baker Perkins industrial complex.

is a multi-billion dollar global steering and driveline business delivering electric and hydraulic power steering systems, steering columns, driveline systems as well as advanced driver assistance systems and automated driving technologies for original equipment manufacturers. Nexteer, Saginaw County's largest employer with more than 5,300 jobs, invested \$60 million in 2018 and created many new technical and engineering positions within the region. Between 2010 and 2018, the automotive leader has invested over \$650 million.



HAUSBECK PICKLE COMPANY is an international supplier of pickles and peppers, processing 40 million pounds of pickles and 42 million pounds of peppers annually. The company is expected to create 15 jobs to support expansion into the retail market. SFI assisted with a Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development grant for \$50,000 towards the \$475,300 investment in new packaging equipment. www.hausbeck.com



T.M.KLEIN AND SONS is a St. Charles-area honey producer that expanded last year with the purchase of two nine-acre parcels. An existing building was completely renovated for cold storage, which frees up manufacturing space at the main location. A 2,400 sq. ft. storage building was added to the main site. Investment in both properties, renovations, new construction and the purchase of a new delivery truck was approximately \$200,000 and 20 jobs were retained. www.tmkleinandsons.com

ANOTHER CHANCE TOURNIQUET, LLC (ACT) is the first dual pressure tourniquet started by Alice Brown and is the Saginaw Future Procurement Technical Assistance Center Government Contractor of the Year. ACT, with a metal spring buckle, is the quickest and easiest tourniquet to use with pictorial instructions on the band. It takes as little as five seconds to apply, while the main competitor takes approximately 68 seconds. ACTs are currently being utilized by the City of Saginaw. www.acttourniquet.com



DUPERON CORPORATION received a 2018 Michigan State Trade Expansion Program (STEP) grant that supported Duperon's exhibit at the Water Environment Federation's Technical Exhibition and Conference - the largest water quality event in the world. 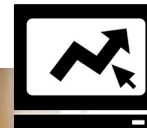

Honey B's Eatery

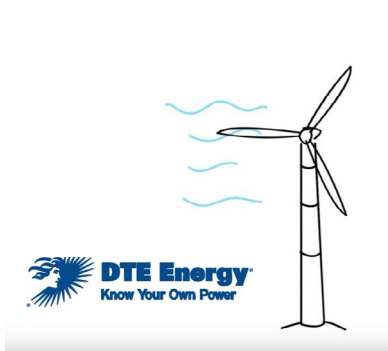
