SAGINAW DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

Saginaw Future entered into an agreement for services with the City of Saginaw in 2015 to administer the Saginaw Downtown Development Authority (DDA). SFI has assisted the DDA in passing a 2-mil tax levy which collects approximately \$150,000 annually. Those funds are utilized to enhance, promote, and foster growth and development in Downtown and Old Town Saginaw.

Manufacturing is vital to Saginaw County because it anchors the local economy—providing high-wage jobs, supporting hundreds of small suppliers, and driving exports and innovation.

Corning Increases Investment & Jobs at Saginaw County Solar Facility

Corning Incorporated recently announced an acceleration of its advanced manufacturing operations in Saginaw County, Mich., to support increasing demand for U.S.-made solar components. Corning's new manufacturing facility is expected to create approximately 400 more, high-paying jobs for a total of 1,500. The new \$1.5 billion facility will extend Corning's opportunity in the solar market, building off its leadership position in the manufacture of hyper-pure polysilicon through its ownership of Hemlock Semiconductor (HSC). This development is anticipated to bolster Michigan's position in the clean energy sector and contribute significantly to the local economy.



Menards Inc. Expands in Saginaw

Menards invested \$21 million at its Saginaw distribution center to build a 38,700-square-foot bagging facility – the company's first of its kind in Michigan. The new facility will package aggregates and Portland cement for distribution to Menards retail stores across the state. The project will retain 76 existing positions and create five new jobs while redeveloping a 30-acre brownfield property with a long history of industrial use.



Cignys Invests in Thomas Township

Cignys' Thomas Township manufacturing facility is undergoing significant upgrades, with a total investment of \$3.8 million to improve infrastructure and operations. The project includes enhancements to the facility's mechanical and electrical systems, as well as structural modifications. Project highlights include mechanical and electrical upgrades, addition of a Bridge Mill, a new paint booth and a barn renovation.

Award Winning Firm in Old Town



Grapp Lerash was founded in 2018 and has recently earned national recognition by ranking No. 3,824 on the Inc. 5,000 list of America's Fastest-Growing Private Companies, achieving an impressive 98 percent revenue growth over three years.

Past honorees include Microsoft, Meta, Chobani, Under Armour, Timberland, Oracle, and Patagonia. The firm's continued growth also represents a

significant investment in Old Town Saginaw.

Grapp Lerash now occupies 7,700 square feet at 122 S. Hamilton St., with a total project investment of \$1.5 million.

Saginaw Future assisted the business in activating a \$5,000 DDA facade improvement grant to support exterior signage upgrades at its new location.

303 Adams Housing Development

Shaheen Development is investing \$11 million in the redevelopment of properties along Adams St. in Old Town into a new four-story mixed-use building with two ground-floor commercial spaces and 30 upper-floor apartments. The project also includes the construction of two three-story townhomes, covered and surface parking and new green space along S. Niagara St. The City of Saginaw approved a Brownfield Plan to assist with demolition and site preparation.





Modern Warehousing in Downtown

Shaheen Development is investing \$2.1 million to redevelop 400 Federal Ave., the former Jacobson's building, into a modern packing and receiving warehouse in downtown Saginaw. The project will transform a long-underutilized two-story commercial building through selective demolition, environmental remediation, and extensive interior and exterior renovations.



Major Expansion for Hunger Solutions Center

The \$8.8 million Hunger Solution Center expansion will serve as the home of Hidden Harvest and the East Side Soup Kitchen, enabling both organizations to work side by side to reduce food insecurity throughout the Great Lakes Bay Region. SFI aided the Hunger Solutions Center in becoming a recipient of a \$5,000 DDA facade improvement grant to support digital sign upgrades at its soon-to-expanded site.



New Life for Historic Schuch Hotel

The historic Schuch Hotel property is located at 301 N. Hamilton St. It was originally constructed in 1868 during the height of the lumbering era. This three-story, 12,176-square-foot building has a rich history and has most recently operated as a restaurant and bar. The developer plans to rehabilitate the property, transforming it into a mixed-use development with a restaurant and bar, and 12 upstairs apartments.

Kremin Inc. Expanding in Frankenmuth

Kremin Inc., located in the Frankenmuth Business Park, is advancing with a significant expansion project valued at \$1.15 million. Since undergoing an ownership and leadership transition in 2010, the company has diversified its operations to focus on prototype and production contract manufacturing. The company will create six new jobs while retaining its existing workforce of 34 employees.



Hub Grant Supports Lazy Dog Pizza Project

Lazy Dog Pizza Inc., a woman-owned business, is relocating and renovating the space at the former Frankenmuth Farmers Market. As part of this move, the company is committing an estimated \$2.2 to \$2.4 million toward the renovation and expansion of its restaurant. These improvements will enhance both customer experience and operational efficiency. The Hub grant is being used to support key infrastructure upgrades.



Prahi Enterprises Project in Swan Creek

Located on the corner of M-52 and Swan Creek Rd, Prahi Enterprises broke ground on its new \$3 million convenience store and quick service restaurant. Prahi Enterprises has demolished the existing building structure and will develop a new, single-story gasoline filling station, convenience store, and quick service restaurant totaling 3,000 sq. ft. SFI assisted the company with a commercial rehabilitation abatement.



Kapex Manufacturing Expanding in Saginaw

Kapex Manufacturing LLC recently acquired Jag, a Saugatuck, MI-based company, and consolidated all operations at its Saginaw facility, increasing revenue by \$500,000. To support this growth, Kapex expanded its production space from 3,000 to 11,000 sq. ft. by purchasing the facility it was leasing within. The company continues to collaborate with Great Lakes Bay Michigan Works! and the Saginaw Career Complex.



Continued Growth for Morley Companies

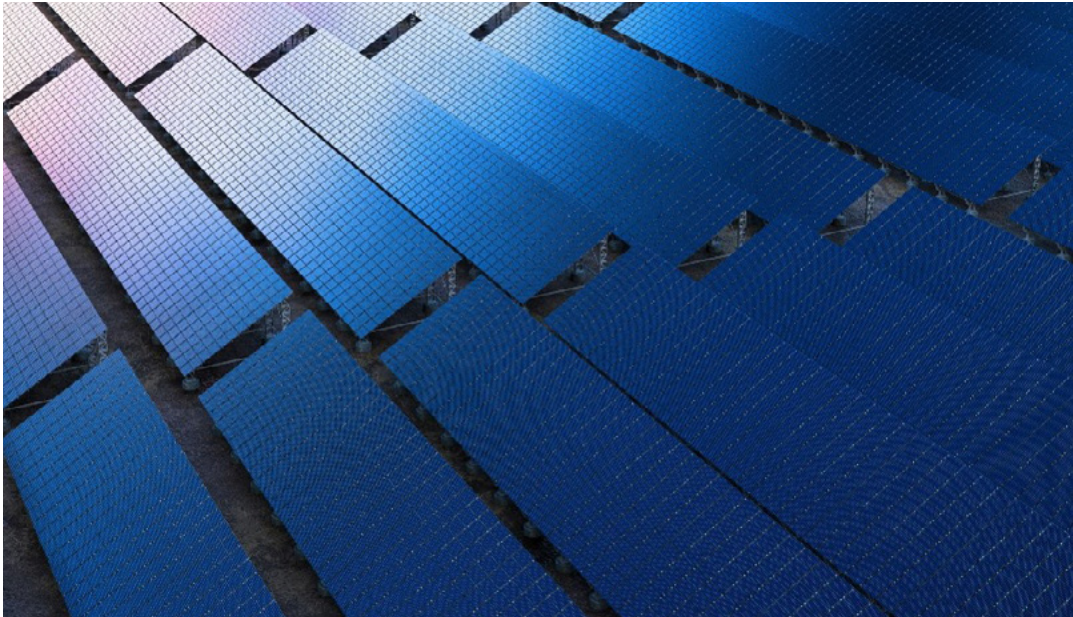
Morley Companies marked a successful year with strong growth, client expansion, and continued innovation across customer experience, technology, and workforce solutions. Morley is now serving over 60 Fortune 500 / Global 500 Brands, employing full-time associates across 20 states. The company's 2025 capital investment in Saginaw totaled \$1.4 million.



Clearbrooke Grows in Tittabawassee Township

Clearbrooke Enterprises, headquartered in Tittabawassee Township, is a woman-owned, Michigan-based lab-to-label contract manufacturer serving personal care and household cleaning brands, operating from an FDA, EPA, and Halal-certified facility. Clearbrooke is expanding its manufacturing footprint by 10,000 sq. ft. and received a Hub grant that will support the company's investment.

New Eagle Creek Solar Park



Eagle Creek Solar Park is a wholly owned subsidiary of EDP Renewables North America LLC and is developing a ground-mounted Solar Energy System or Solar Park. The Eagle Creek Solar Park includes a 120-megawatt (MW) alternating current (AC) solar photovoltaic (PV) energy-generating facility on approximately 831 acres of agricultural land in Fremont Township., west of St. Charles.

The park will generate enough clean

energy to power the equivalent of 32,000 Michigan homes. The project represents a capital investment of approximately \$250 million. In addition, the project will generate more than \$30 million in tax revenue supporting local schools and community services over the operational life of the project.

Hundreds of construction jobs will be created as well as several permanent jobs during the operational phase of the project.

Workforce Development for Fullerton Tool

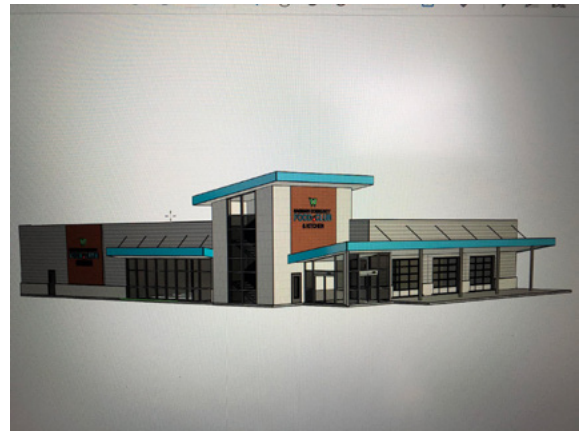
Fullerton Tool Company operates manufacturing facilities in the City of Saginaw and Thomas Township. The company produces a comprehensive range of high-quality products — including end mills, drills, reamers, burrs, saws, key-seat cutters, and custom tooling — engineered to meet the diverse needs of industries worldwide. Fullerton Tool was recently awarded a Going PRO Talent Fund grant to support the training of 44 employees across 12 specialized courses.





Going PRO Grant for J.R. Heineman & Sons, Inc.

Established in 1910, J.R. Heineman & Sons, Inc. is a general construction company headquartered in the City of Saginaw. The company's project portfolio spans a wide range of industries, including commercial, financial, retail, industrial, healthcare, educational sectors, and special projects. J.R. Heineman & Sons received a Going PRO Talent Fund grant to support the training of 30 existing U.S. Department of Labor registered apprentices.



Saginaw Community Food Club Under Construction

The Saginaw Community Food Club & Kitchen is a non-profit grocery store that prioritizes choice, participation, affordability and access to healthy food. The store will be in a new building on the block of Franklin, Meredith and Holden Streets; just west of MyMichigan Medical Center Saginaw. This project is an innovative solution to food insecurity that provides members the ability to shop with points based on income levels and to access fresh, wholesome food.

Training Grant for Amsted Automotive



Amsted Automotive was established in 2021 following the merger of two core Tier1 automotive supply units of Amsted Industries: Means Industries and Burgess-Norton. Amsted's Saginaw facilities specialize in transmission systems and other automotive components, while also including work related to electric vehicle technologies. The Going PRO Talent Fund grant will provide direct support to its Saginaw location, aiding 21 employees for 13 manufacturing-related technical skills courses. The company's primary operations are based in the United States.

New Technology for Nexteer



Nexteer Automotive continues to invest in cutting-edge technology and sustainability at its Saginaw, Michigan operations, reinforcing the region's role in future mobility.

At the Saginaw site, the company has activated a 25-acre solar field with over 17,000 panels that will generate renewable energy, lower emissions and reduce operational costs as part of its broader commitment to clean technology and innovation.

These investments support Nexteer's work on advanced steering, electrification and motion control systems while strengthening its foothold in Michigan's automotive tech ecosystem.

Through strategic upgrades and sustainable initiatives, Nexteer is driving long-term growth and technological leadership in Saginaw's manufacturing and R&D landscape.

New Ebony Elevate Beauty School

Saginaw Future provided key support in the successful launch of Ebony Elevate Beauty School, including the development of operational policies and procedures. SFI also helped to establish a strategic partnership with the Saginaw Career Complex through direct engagement with its leadership team to explore collaborative initiatives. SFI supported the creation of a working relationship with Great Lakes Bay Michigan Works! and Buena Vista Charter Township.





Abele Greenhouse & Garden Center to Host Weddings & Events

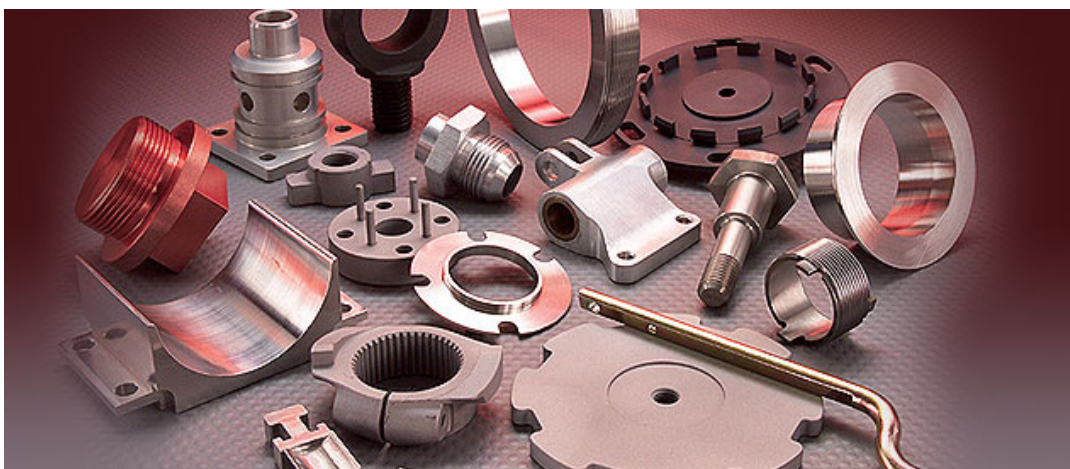
Abele Greenhouse is expanding its operations to include wedding and event hosting, building on the success of its initial events held in 2024 and spring 2025. The project was awarded a \$20,000 Hub grant to support the owner's investment of \$25,000 for the event planning equipment. SFI played a key role in connecting Abele Greenhouse to the grant. The project is expected to result in the hiring of three part-time staff and one full-time coordinator.



Multiple Projects for Covenant HealthCare

Investment in Saginaw's health care sector continues to accelerate. The Covenant HealthCare College of Medicine at Central Michigan University represents a \$40 million commitment, and the Medical Diamond West and the Extraordinary Neighborhood initiative reflect additional multi-million-dollar investments. A multi-facility development located at W. Genesee Ave. and Michigan Ave. also includes a key partnership with the Saginaw County Health Department.

Government Contractor of the Year



Dresco Machining is a precision machining company serving government and commercial customers with high-quality, dependable manufacturing solutions. The company specializes in CNC machining, precision metal components, custom machined parts, and tight-tolerance manufacturing, delivering accurate results from prototype through full production. In 2025, Dresco was awarded approximately 873 contracts totaling \$2,988,511, demonstrating the company's strong performance record, responsiveness, and commitment to meeting government requirements.



Savoy Renovations in Downtown Saginaw

SFI via the Saginaw DDA applied for and received on behalf of the Savoy a \$25,000 Match on Main Grant through the MEDC. The grant is to support activation of the second floor of the bar as an event space. The project is ongoing and is slated to open in 2026. The event space is going to add seven jobs to the Savoy team. The 14,800 sq.ft. Savoy Bar & Grill project was a \$177,000 investment.



Gordie's Bar Opens in the Bancroft

Gordie's Bar, located in the historic Bancroft Building in Downtown Saginaw, offers a comfortable gathering place for friends, families, and coworkers, featuring craft cocktails, cold beer, live entertainment, and game-day specials. The new business included a full kitchen buildout — complete with a hood and exhaust system — along with extensive interior design and exterior signage improvements.



MKR Fabricators Receive \$25,000 Industry 4.0 Grant

MKR Fabricators is a full-service fabrication and machining company, providing service to the aerospace, defense, automotive, chemical, and food processing industries. MKR invested \$125,000 in automation that will provide opportunities to produce new products, insource outside work, reduce cost, and advance integration of automation into its system. Two jobs were retained and five new jobs were created.



HEX Equipment is Modernizing Operations
