Air Advantage received \$64.25 million in federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding to offer broadband service to customers in 13 counties throughout the region. Frankenmuth based Air Advantage estimates the project will serve about 698,000 people, 21,000 businesses, and 4,000 community institutions, while creating 142 jobs. The company secured additional funds through support from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC). Air Advantage has added 20 new jobs and expects to add another 122 jobs to implement the federal project. The City of Frankenmuth, Frankenmuth Downtown Development Authority and SFI assisted the company with financing opportunities, supported the project during the process of securing the grant funds and identifying a site for the expansion.
