Established in 1992, SFI is a private, non-profit alliance of local businesses, the Saginaw County Chamber of Commerce, the County and City of Saginaw, 16 local municipalities, education, labor organizations and local foundations.



Mission and Vision

To advance economic growth in Saginaw County.

To be the leading organization in Saginaw County, providing proactive and focused economic development assistance, striving for diversified growth, job creation and retention, increased business investment and tax base, and a positive environment for businesses to thrive.



Services & Expertise

Saginaw Future assists companies with financial and incentive packaging, state programs, government contracts, identifying and developing sites and provides access to shovel ready FREE land. SFI also serves as an advocate for business investment projects, connects with resources to address workforce needs and serves as a community liaison, through our service contracts with local and state government partners.



Budget

SFI is a non-profit 501(c)(3) corporation with an annual operating budget of \$1.2 million. SFI contracts with the County and City of Saginaw and 16 local units of government for economic development services, and receives nearly half of its funding from 206 private business contributors, foundations, sponsors and individuals. SFI also receives grants from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) and U.S. Department of Defense for procurement initiatives.

Since 1963, SCE has been manufacturing both standard custom electrical enclosures. The company headquarters and its 310,000 sq. ft. manufacturing facility will remain in Saginaw Charter Township. That site is completely built out and landlocked. SCE expects to create 35 jobs over the next five years and the MEDC, EDC of the County of Saginaw, Thomas Township and SFI supported the project's development.

Turn One recently purchased new equipment that will help the company in-source component production and Intricate Machine – dba Eagle Machine will do work for them. SFI is working with the City of Saginaw on incentives to support the growth.

This recent activity is a continuation of a \$1 million EPA Superfund cleanup of the former Baker Perkins industrial complex.

The company is expected to create 15 jobs to support expansion into the retail market. T.M.KLEIN AND SONS is a St. Charles-area honey producer that expanded last year with the purchase of two nine-acre parcels. An existing building was completely renovated for cold storage, which frees up manufacturing space at the main location. A 2,400 sq. ft. storage building was added to the main site. Bayne's Apple Valley was purchased by new owners, who completed a store interior remodel and added new decking. Bayne's also renovated a house to host corporate events and gatherings.
