Dick Garber purchased an Ontario Hockey League (OHL) team from NorthBay, Ontario and it is now located in Saginaw. The OHL is a member of the umbrella Canadian Hockey League, along with the Western Hockey League (WHL) and Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL). The OHL offers 16-20 year old players an opportunity to develop their hockey skills while attending a local high school, college or university. More than 70% of players on the National Hockey League (NHL) active rosters come from the Canadian Hockey League. In fact nine of the NHL's Red Wings' 20man roster played in the OHL. The list includes Steve Yzerman, Sean Avery, Boyd Devereaux, Kris Draper, Manny Legace, Kirk Maltby, Darren McCarty, Brendan Shanahan, and Jason Williams.

### Medical Corridor Expands Again

SSP Associates announced plans to add 30,000 sq. ft. of medical office space. The firm had originally planned to construct a two story, 60,000 sq. ft. facility for the Michigan CardioVascular Institute (MCVI). The expected new investment in this project is \$3 million (with \$1 million immediately and another \$2 expected to complete the intererior once a tenant has been identified).

The City of Saginaw received \$1.69 million in state tax funds to assemble the site. An additional \$60,000 federal Brownfield Grant was provided for environmental assessments.

Completion of the MCVI facility is set for early next year.

# Michigan Sugar in Good Hands

The Michigan Sugar Company was purchased out of bankruptcy by a sugar beet cooperative formed by the Great Lakes Sugar Beet Growers Association. SFI assisted the firm in obtaining a grant from the Rural Development Administration for the feasibility study. SFI also facilitated a meeting with Doug Rothwell, President of MEDC, to discuss legislative issues dealing with sugar and by writing letters of support for a \$5 million loan from the state. The \$18.5 million investment will retain 350 direct jobs at area processing plants along with 1200 grower contracts. Michigan Sugar Company has contracted with area growers for thousands of acres and has invested several million dollars in transfer stations and research facilities throughout Saginaw County in recent years.

# Davenport University on the Move

Davenport University will be relocating its downtown Saginaw campus to 5300 Bay Road, the former site of the McDonald Oldsmobile Cadillac dealership.

The new location in Kochville Twp. will emphasize Davenport's mission of convenience and affordabilty. The move is an opportunity for students from Midland and Bay City to have better access to the campus. The new facility will provide improved classroom space and parking, while allowing for possible future upgrades. Administrators plan for the new 27,000 square-foot campus to be open for the start of fall classes on August 26, 2002.

SFI is working with local investors to redevelop the former university campus in downtown Saginaw.

# SFI Celebrates Ten Years of Success in Saginaw County

On February 28, 2002, the staff of Saginaw Future Inc. held its annual meeting highlighting achievements made in 2001. Combined project efforts for the year generated 26 business expansions, attracted seven new businesses to the area. created 435 jobs, and retained 487 jobs. New businesses Saginaw Future attracted to Saginaw County included Saginaw Diversified Services, Progeny Properties LLC, Ollesheimer & Son, J&M Manufacturing, SSP Associates/ Michigan CardioVascular Institute, and SpringHill Suites. These businesses totaled more than \$17 million in investments and accounted for the creation of 107

new jobs. There were more than 30 attraction and expansion projects in Saginaw County during 2001. Saginaw Future facilitated the expansion of Accurate Carbide. Bernier Cast Metals, Citizens Bank, DDI Engineering, Saginaw Products, and Wright-K Technology, Inc. These companies are just a few that succeeded in expanding their businesses while retaining and creating employment. In addition, SFI assisted Saginaw's largest employer, Delphi Automotive, in applying for tax credit with the Michigan Economic Development Corporation and in seeking local approvals required to begin a multimillion dollar investment to add technology at its Buena Vista Township facilities.

# SFI's President, JoAnn Crary, Attends Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) 2002 World Congress

"Engineering for the Environment - Challenges and Opportunities" was the topic at this year's SAE 2002 World Congress held March 4-7 at the Cobo Center in Detroit. This expo is the largest automotive parts and components exhibition in the world. More than 1,000 suppliers and manufacturers, including 300 plus from outside of the U.S., participated to offer in-depth technical support. Attending the expo provided Saginaw County exposure to the global automotive community.

# Mich-Again Voted #1

Michigan was voted number one for new and expanding business facilities in the nation, according to *Site Selection* magazine. Though the Governor's Cup was awarded to Illinois, the business community ranked Michigan as the true winner in 2001.

"Unfortunately, at the eleventh hour of the contest *Site Selection* magazine changed the rules by switching to a new system for awarding the actual Governor's Cup," stated Doug Rothwell, president & CEO of the MEDC. "If the magazine kept with the traditional judging, the Cup would be in Michigan today. The true judge of the best place to grow is the business community. They have once again voted overwhelmingly for Michigan."

Under the new system, ten new criterions have been established. Of the ten, Michigan was in the top five.

Michigan secured 1st place for number of new and expanded facilities, and also for new and expanded facilities per one million population in 2001. Michigan captured 2nd place for total capital investment in new and expanded facilities per one million. The state ranked 3rd place for number of top 100 metros. Michigan also captured 5th place for number of top 100 small towns.

According to *Site Selection* magazine, Saginaw County ranked 9th for new and expanded facilities projects with a total of 42 in 2001. This is an increase from 2000 in which Saginaw County had 36 new projects and ranked 11th. Michigan as a whole generated a total of 1,419 new projects.

# Davenport Inn Michigan's Best Small Business

Davenport Inn has been awarded Michigan's Best Small Business Award for 2001. Recipients are awarded based on the company's contributions to the growth and vitality of their surrounding community by managing its increasing development, improving profitability, and creating jobs. Employment has increased from 5 employees to 50 full-time positions at Davenport. SSP Associates is investing \$4.5 million in the facility. The expected completion of improvements at the Inn has been scheduled for November, 2003. The Shaheen family received the honor at the May 1 Michigan Small Business Development Center's Award Ceremony in Lansing.

# Companies Receive Economic Development Job Training Grant (EDJT)

The Economic Development Job Training Grant (EDJT) program provides training funds to businesses to promote new job opportunities, provide advanced training for existing employees, skilled training for new workers to strengthen the state's economic base.

The grants are available through the Michigan Economic Development Corporation. Funds are released through a competitive application process. Once a firm has defined its training needs, training funds are pursued through the appropriate eligible entity. Eligible course categories include: applied academics, equipment specific, process improvement (ISO/ QS 9000) and technical training. The recent average training grant has been \$900 per trainee.

In a typical project, SFI staff and a provider such as Delta College Corporate Services or SVSU MMTC will meet with a company to discuss their employment plans and training needs. Delta will help develop a training plan that includes cost estimates. These costs may be covered by the EDJT program, the Governors Scholarship Fund, On-The-Job (OJT) funding or Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) funds.
