
Hausbeck Pickle Expands in the City of Saginaw

Hausbeck Pickle Company Inc. has expanded its facilities to a city of Saginaw location with a \$1.4 million investment. An additional \$2.025 is expected to be invested in new equipment and facility development.

The company had been looking to expand its business for the past two years, specifically, searching for 40,000 sq. ft. of warehousing or manufacturing space.

Hausbeck Pickle had been researching and considering sites and incentives in Saginaw County. Its search also included Michigan's southern border communities and in Indiana to reduce transportation costs.

"Because of an increasingly competitive market, it was necessary to take a look at a number of options for Hausbeck to continue to grow," said Tim Hausbeck, general manager of Hausbeck Pickle Company Inc. "The city of Saginaw, the state and Saginaw Future worked together to develop a

competitive package for this expansion project to be in Saginaw County."

Hausbeck Pickle eventually chose the former Gallade' Technologies building on Hess Avenue located in a Renaissance Zone in the city of Saginaw.

New Golf Centre Planned for Kochville Township

Kochville Township will be the home of a new \$3.6 million golfing facility. The Saginaw Golf Centre will be located on Tittabawassee Road, west of Center Road.

The almost 20,000 sq. ft. facility will provide state-of-the-art golf learning facilities with 27 heated tee-boxes, chipping green, putting green and short game area.

The Saginaw Golf Centre will also feature a café, golf pro shop, a strength and flexibility area geared


for the needs of golfers, and office space.

The project's public face that many Saginaw residents will find recognizable is former Saginaw

"I'm the managing partner. I'll be in charge of everything else other than teaching golf," said Desrosiers.

warehousing but intends to construct an additional 40,000 sq. ft. manufacturing building on the site later this fall. Hausbeck's expansion will result in 34 jobs retained and 10 created.

Saginaw Future assisted Hausbeck Pickle with site location and facilitated meetings with local municipalities. SFI is currently working with the company to secure a Single Business Tax credit through the Michigan Economic Development Corporation.

Hausbeck Pickle, established in 1923, has enjoyed continued company growth and success. In 2002, the company invested \$200,000 in its Spaulding Township location that created 17 jobs.

The company plans to maintain its headquarters in Spaulding, while expanding in the nearby city of Saginaw location.

The Hausbeck Pickle Company specializes in brining and processing of pickles and peppers. Two of its major customers are Subway and Burger King.

who was responsible for its design.

Matthews has sculpted at least two dozen Michigan golf courses, including Bucks Run in Mount Pleasant, the back nine at Hidden Oaks in St. Louis and done considerable work at the Saginaw Country Club.

The Kochville Township Planning Commission approved a special use permit and site plan for the 37-acre property in November 2004. Tentative plans call for the Saginaw Golf Centre to open in the fall of 2005.

The Centre seems to be a perfect fit for area golfers looking to improve their game. Saginaw County is home to 13 public golf courses, including three championship level courses.

Saginaw Future assisted the Saginaw Golf Centre project with its pursuit of financing.

Merrill Tool Expanding Again!

Merrill Tool & Machine, Inc. has experienced tremendous growth due to its successful efforts and sales diversification, along with the growth of key customers.

Merrill Tool, established in 1968, plans to add 20,000 sq. ft. of new

manufacturing space. Located in the village of Merrill, the company will also be adding new equipment that includes additional cranes.

Merrill Tool's investment is expected to exceed \$2.55 million and will create 15 new jobs. The company benefitted from funding from the Saginaw County Revolving Loan Fund, which is administered by Saginaw Future.

Merrill Tool and the community were also assisted by SFI with a tax incentive.

The latest project is the company's third expansion in the past three years



in the village of Merrill.

and its manufacturing floor space will

be over 40,000 sq. ft. The growing company invested more than \$1.7 million in 2003 and 2004.

Merrill Tool fabricates machine components for special machine builders, including fixture build and mechanical assembly.

Merrill Tool is ISO 9002 certified and has received certification from the Federal Aviation Administration as an official airplane repair facility. The company has over 60 employees and is affiliated with Merrill Fabricators, and Merritech in the city of Saginaw.

New Image Alliance Web Site



The Saginaw Valley Image Alliance, part of Saginaw County Vision 2020, recently launched its new Web sitewww.thesaginawvalley.com.

The Web site is essentially a searchable Web directory highlighting the Mid-Michigan counties of Bay, Midland and Saginaw.

The directory includes links to non-profit, civic and government sites that provide users with a wide variety of information on the region. New links and information are added as they become available.

The development of the Web site was made possible by a grant from GM - Saginaw Metal Casting Operations.

Meetings with public and private sector leaders resulted in the Web directory format.

The quality of existing Saginaw Valley sites, such as the newly designed Saginaw County Vision 2020 and Saginaw County Convention & Visitors Bureau sites, led to the decision to create a directory to consolidate and funnel users to them.

The site is a must see for people new to the area and a useful guide to the region for residents.

Fast Tek Continues to Grow

The Fast-Tek Group LLC has experienced significant success in recent years and is working to continue its development. The company's Buena Vista Charter Township facility is located in the Morley Industrial Park.

Due to an increased sales volume, Fast Tek required working capital and sought assistance from the Saginaw County Revolving Loan Fund (RLF), which is administered by SFI.

The Saginaw County RLF loan led

to a \$1.2 million investment by the Fast Tek Group. The company expects to hire an additional 40 employees this year after hiring more than 30 last year.

In 2004, Fast Tek invested \$682,000 in its Buena Vista facility and the entire industrial park benefited from a \$304,000 infrastructure grant from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation to improve access to the park and accommodate increased truck traffic.

The Fast Tek Group has five locations in the Midwest and performs sorting, inspection, rework and containment services. The company's primary customers are automotive producers and suppliers in the United States and Canada.

Department of Defense Opportunities



The Department of Defense (DoD) 2005.2 Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) solicitation has been posted. The DoD's SBIR program funds early-stage research and development projects through small technology companies.

These projects serve DoD needs and have the potential for commercialization in private sector and/or military markets. The program is funded at approximately \$1.079 billion for 2005.

As part of its SBIR program, the DoD issues an SBIR solicitation four times a year.

The SBIR solicitation explains research and development needs and invites proposals from small companies - firms organized for profit with 500 or fewer employees, including all affiliated firms.

From May 2nd through June 14th, small businesses have the opportunity to contact the topic point of contact to ask questions, as well as to receive clarifications.



Nearly \$100 Million Investment Plan for Delphi



Delphi Steering is located in Buena Vista Charter Township.

The Delphi Corporation plans to invest nearly \$100 million in its steering facility in Buena Vista Charter Township. The investment will improve existing processes and allow for the implementation of new technology.

Delphi received a Brownfield Single Business Tax credit (SBT) for up to \$99.9 million in capital investment for Delphi Steering's Plants 3, 5, 7, 9 and a portion of Plant 4. The entire multi-plant complex was determined to be functionally obsolete.

The new incentive will assist Delphi in becoming more competitive in a challenging period for the automotive industry, retain jobs and will ultimately

result in a state-of-the-art facility.

The Michigan Economic Development Corporation and Saginaw Future had been in discussions with Delphi to help identify investment opportunities and proactively pursue assistance. In turn, the Saginaw County Board of Commissioners supported the SBT incentive, which received approval from the state.

The project is for the SBT incentive only and does not involve any local property taxes or tax increment financing. Delphi's previous five-year Brownfield Plan, approved by the board of commissioners in 2000, included Plants 1, 6 and a portion of Plant 4.

\$1.3 Million for Saginaw River Dredging

Governor Jennifer M. Granholm recently announced more than \$1.3 million in Community Development Block Grant funding for Saginaw County.

The grant, made available through the Michigan Economic Development Corporation, will help finance the silt relocation portion of the Saginaw River dredging project. Low water levels combined with silt accumulation threaten to severely limit the capacity of the river to accommodate commercial freighter traffic.

"The Saginaw River is part of Michigan's vital transportation infrastructure," Granholm said. "We cannot sit by and allow it to become unusable. Jobs are at stake and more stand to be created."

The Saginaw River is the state's eighth largest port by cargo volume with about 4.6 million tons of



river commerce annually, according to the Michigan Department of Transportation.

The Federal Army Corps of Engineers has committed funds to the dredging portion of the project and part of the costs of relocating silt removed from the river bed.

The total federal contribution is approximately \$2.5 million. Saginaw County is expected to contribute \$333,000 in addition to \$334,000 from the Saginaw County River Alliance.

Saint Mary's Emergency Facility Expands

Millions of people live with chronic pain. With no relief, long-term pain impacts personal relationships, work productivity and daily activities. A new expansion at Saint Mary's Ambulatory Care Center on Towne Centre in Saginaw Township seeks to address those needs.



Saint Mary's Emergency Care Center is located on 4599 Towne Centre in Saginaw Township.

The 7,300 sq. ft. expansion to the second floor of the Towne Centre location is adding significant space to the pain treatment center and the digestive care department. The project nearly doubles the size of both areas. The additional space will improve access, reduce waiting time for patients and improve patient privacy.

The Saint Mary's Foundation funded the nearly \$3 million expansion project. Open houses and a blessing took place in the second week of April and the new space is expected to become operational very soon.

The Ambulatory Care Center was constructed in 1992. When it was built, there were plans to expand in 2000, for the addition of laboratory services, endoscopy and pain treatment. As demand for those services grew, the need to expand was realized and development of the current addition began.

ASE Seeking Wage Information
