# Suniva Selected for Loan Guarantee

Suniva, Inc., a U.S. manufacturer of high-efficiency monocrystalline silicon solar cells and modules, recently announced that the company has been selected for the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Loan Guarantee Program under the DOE's Innovative Energy Efficiency, Renewable Energy and Advanced Transmission and Distribution Technologies Solicitation.

Upon the completion of the DOE's due diligence and subject to the successful negotiation of the terms of a loan for approximately \$141 million, Suniva plans to start the construction of a new manufacturing plant in Saginaw County, Michigan.

Building such a manufacturing plant could create approximately 500 direct jobs at Suniva, while creating an additional 2,000 indirect jobs for the Michigan economy according to the Michigan Economic Development Corporation. Suniva currently employs a diverse workforce—approximately a quarter of its employees are military veterans and many others were hired from shuttered automotive plants.

# **MTG Develops Turbines**







Merrill Technologies Group (MTG) and a handful of Michigan companies received an Advanced Energy Manufacturing Tax Credit (48C) through the American Reinvestment & Recovery Act of 2009.

The Department of Treasury awarded \$2.3 billion in tax credits nationwide for qualified investments in advanced energy projects to support new, expanded, or re-equipped domestic manufacturing facilities.

MTG was awarded \$22,021,500 towards an investment of \$73 million in advanced manufacturing equipment to support the production of nacelles for Northern Power's new 2.2 Mega Watt utility-scale wind turbine. The project is expected to progress through prototype and pilot phases into full production.

The company is producing two prototypes, one of which will be launched third quarter, 2010 in Michigan. MTG is seeking a pilot program of 10 to 20 units for production in 2011, with commercial scale planned for 2012. To date, the project has resulted in 16 jobs created and 12 jobs retained with \$3.2 million invested.

Saginaw Future has worked with InCal since its inception, most recently with an investment incentive.




# More Growth for Hausbeck Pickle

Hausbeck Pickle, established in 1923, specializes in brining and processing of pickles and peppers. Two of its major customers are Subway and Burger King.


The company anticipates starting construction on the manufacturing space this Spring with the tank yard addi-



Saginaw Future assisted the company and the City of Saginaw with a Renaissance Zone extension application that required city and county resolutions of support. The project received approval by the Michigan Strategic Fund Board in March.

In addition to the announced projects, Hausbeck has recently expanded its facilities to include a new state-of-the-art warehouse and second processing plant that ensures additional capacity as well as manufacturing redundancy.

# **USG Invests \$1 Million Plus**



U.S. Graphite, Inc. (USG) purchased the former Kelly Tire building adjacent to its 1820 E. Holland Ave. location in the City of Saginaw approximately a year ago. USG has invested over \$1 million in substantial improvements since occupying the building.

The long time City of Saginaw employer also purchased new presses that will be used to service new clients. The expansion project will retain 46 employees.

# Two Community Impact Awards

Suniva's announced project and Nexteer Automotive's recent investment commitment received 2010 Corporate Investment & Community Impact (CiCi) Awards, presented by Trade & Industry Development magazine.

Suniva Inc. was selected based on its \$250 million plan to construct six produc-



tion lines of its ARTisun photovoltaic cell in Thomas Township, Michigan.

At full capacity, the company estimates this project will produce photovoltaic cells with a capacity to provide over 400 megawatts of solar power annually (roughly enough power to generate electricity for 100,000 households).

Nexteer Automotive, formerly the steering division of Delphi Corporation, was also selected. It is the only global Tier One automotive supplier focused on advanced steering and driveline systems technology.

The company plans to invest \$413 million to expand and actively pursue diverse new business opportunities and retain its independent engineering capability.

With more than 1,000 project submissions from throughout North America, Suniva and Nexteer were chosen as two of only 15 finalists.



# More than \$2.3 Million in Government Contracts



# **New STARS Offices**



The Saginaw Transit Authority Regional Services (STARS) recently held a grand opening at its renovated administrative offices in the Rosa Parks Transit Center. Located at 615 Johnson St. in the City of Saginaw, the office project was funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

STARS is a public transportation system for the Urbanized Saginaw Area, which travels about 1.5 million miles per year and operates daily including Saturdays.

The agency renovated the first floor of the administrative offices, including building a board room and offices. STARS will save approximately \$30,000 a year in rental space costs that will no longer be necessary.

Over 2,700 people utilize Saginaw buses each day for work, doctor visits, shopping or school. STARS also serves as an effective solution to mobility challenged citizens. Annually, over 48,000 senior citizens and persons with disabilities utilize its LIFT service.

STARS credited the Federal Congressional Team, Federal Transit Administration, State Legislators, Michigan Department of Transportation and the County of Saginaw for supporting the project.


