

AT&T INVESTS IN DOWNTOWN SAGINAW

AT&T will relocate 230 of its employees to its office in Downtown Saginaw, after a series of consolidation measures. The communications company will invest as much as \$1 million in building upgrades with the move that began this spring and will continue through the year. The investment represents the next step in a series of continuing upgrades to AT&T's regional headquarters located at 309 S. Washington Ave.

The City of Saginaw is supporting the project through assistance with needed employee parking. The company worked with the City of Saginaw and Saginaw Future to address project development issues. AT&T is also in final discussions to sell its Saginaw Charter Township facility.

CONSOLIDATION FOR MI WORKS

Great Lakes Bay Michigan Works! will consolidate services from three locations and house approximately 45 employees on E. Genesee Ave. in the City of Saginaw. A newly constructed 17,500 sq. ft., one-story office building will replace several abandoned buildings and vacant parcels on E. Genesee near South Baum St. The agency's Board of Directors approved it entering into a lease with Saginaw developer Downtown Area Development (DAD) IV, LLC.

Demolition and environmental work is expected to begin after the City of Saginaw acts on a Brownfield incentive. Construction is targeted for completion for the end of 2012 and the total investment by DAD IV is expected to reach \$2.8 million. Great Lakes Bay Michigan Works! plans to consolidate its offices, including 614 Johnson St. and the computer training lab at 4038 Bay Rd., at the new Downtown Saginaw location.

A \$35,000 Department of Energy grant and a \$95,000 energy loan through the County of Saginaw will cover the array's expense.
